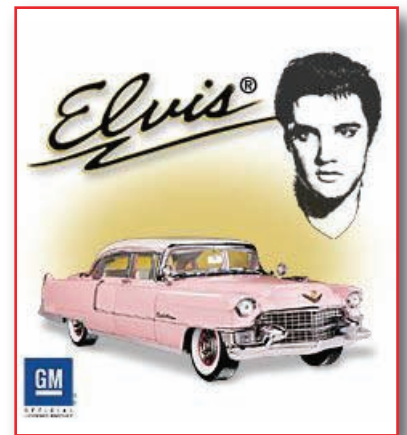
Elvis Presley's musical contribution, cultural impact, and artistic achievement made him an unsurpassed 20th Century icon. Needless to say, his legend lives on today. "It's All About Elvis" is a unique entertainment event especially suited for a Performing Arts Center or non-profit organization. Rex March Fowler of the celebrated folk/rock duo Aztec Two-Step wrote and produced *200 Cadillacs*, the centerpiece of the show, which stands apart from other documentary films about Elvis by focusing on one fascinating aspect of The King's legendary generosity - giving away Cadillacs to his friends and to total strangers.

The Dinner

Eat like Elvis with a feast that's fit for a 'King.' The evening begins with a catered, yet informal buffet-style dinner featuring Elvis' favorite recipes - including his infamous 'peanut butter and nanner' sandwich - quartered and served as an appetizer to prevent immediate cardiac arrest. All of the featured dishes were gleaned from Brenda Butler's bestseller, "Are You Hungry Tonight? Elvis' Favorite Recipes" (see below). The menu can also be tailored to the 'taste' of each individual event while still keeping its distinct southern culinary flare.

The Movie

Elvis Presley's gift of choice was a shiny new Cadillac car. Through personal accounts, vintage video clips and over 200 photographs, the film *200 Cadillacs* details an aspect of Elvis' personality only casually explored until now - his extraordinary generosity to family, friends, associates, and even complete strangers. Some of the many people who recount their gifts and personal reminiscences of Elvis include Presley's original band-mate DJ Fontana, longtime girlfriend Linda Thompson, Myrna Smith of the Sweet Inspirations, The Jordanaires' Gordon Stoker, personal nurse Marian Cocke, hairdresser Larry Geller, karate instructor Kang Rhee, and 'Memphis Mafia' side-kicks Sonny West and Jerry Schilling. The film is interspersed with original songs written by Rex Fowler, John Hiatt, Syd Straw and others.



The Show

After the buffet and movie Rex will conduct a Q&A, then perform live renditions of The King's early classics and some original songs composed specifically for the movie soundtrack. Rex's concert is available either as a solo performance or with "The Extraordanaires," his dazzling backing band.
